# FY 2018 in Focus

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## NIFA in FY 2018

- Continuing Resolution (4<sup>th</sup> in 2018)
  - Funds NIFA activities for the next three weeks
  - At approx. 2017 level

- NIFA will continue to release Requests for Applications (RFA) for competitive programs.
  - AgrAbility RFA expected to be released in February, 2018.



# AgrAbility in FY 2017

Farm Safety funding line (which includes AgrAbility & Youth Farm Safety) was at \$4,610,000

- After administrative costs, approximately \$4.1 million was allocated toward AgrAbility
  - 18 continuing (17 SRAPs and 1 NAP) and 3 new SRAPs
  - SRAPs received up to \$180,000
  - NAP received \$531,000

### Youth Farm Safety Education and Certification FY2017

- Continue the national coordinated approach of providing agricultural safety and health education for youth
- \$100,000 per year for up to 4 years; 3 awards.
  - *SAY National Clearinghouse Project* to continue efforts made to date with SAY Clearinghouse.
  - *YFSEC Instructor Training Project* to support recruitment and training of youth farm safety instructors in currently available youth farm safety curricula.
  - YFSEC Youth Training Project to continue with development of new/enhancement of current youth farm safety curricula, implementation/piloting of those curricula with youth, and evaluation of youth training.



# Beginning Farmer and Rancher Development Program

- In FY 2018, approximately \$17.7 million available
- 2018 RFA was released in November. Applications due Feb. 8, 2018.
