- Being in a windowless hotel conference room with many people we do not know...
 - 70% of contacts are not followed up!
- Ongoing organic process of building relationships with people you like...
 - Life long practice of meeting people you can contribute to



ACTIVE Networking Tips

- Focus on giving, giving, giving vs. getting
 - Knowledge of what AgrAbility is and does
- Listen more than you talk
 - Get to know the passion behind the profesional
- Think long term
- Do not over commit
- Take action immediately, if you agree to do something for someone
 - Email the resource you're talking about immediately, less work for you later
- Go to events/presentations with the idea to make a friend

- Have 2 people staff the booth or arrive early
- Connect to learn about resources
 - Increase your resource library
 - Get requests to present about AgrAbility

 - Watermelon and onion harvest



 - Farmworker health programs




