

History of Opioid Use in the US

- □ In the 60's, 80% of the opioid abusers got hooked on heroin
- □ In the 2000's, 75% of opioid abusers started with prescription opioids
- An estimated 2.1 million people suffer from Substance Use Disorders related to opioid pain relievers
- The number of unintentional opioid overdose deaths quadrupled since 1999

Agricultural and Rural Issues

- A 2017 survey by the National Farmers Union and the American Farm Bureau revealed that as many as 74% of farmers have been directly impacted by the opioid crisis. <u>Infographic</u>
- A Massachusetts study found that opioid-related deaths in farming, fishing, and forestry was 5 times higher than other workers
- Rates of drug overdoses are rising in rural areas, surpassing rates in urban areas (CDC, 2017)





OxyContin Maker Granted Patent for Opioid-Addiction Treatment


Purdue Pharma, which helped create the opioid epidemic, has been granted a patent for a drug that would help clean it up. But should they be allowed to profit from their own mess?


