
Indiana AgVets Eligibility

Mentoring and Job Coaching

- Interns will be assigned a job coach/mentor
 - Personalized curriculum
 - Depends on interests, needs, schedule, motivation of each AgVet
- Internship host mentor
 - Coordinates with project staff and intern
- Disability services
 - AgrAbility to assist AgVets and host sites to ensure accessibility
 - Counselors & mentors for service-related challenges (PTSD)

- Commercial Pesticide Applicator Core Training



AgVets Training Supplemental Options


- Advanced trainings & short courses

AgVets Internships (11 AgVets currently)

- Stipends provided to interns (no cost to hosts)
- Interns may be placed at:
 - Grain, livestock, or specialty farms
 - Agribusinesses such as crop services, grain handling, machinery dealers, etc.
 - Nurseries, turf & landscape operations, forest products
 - Other locations depending on AgVet's interests
- Purdue Agricultural Centers partnership
- Support from Indiana agribusinesses, commodity organizations for intern placement
- Sites throughout Indiana
