- 1-800 Number Call Center






GENDER




RACE & ETHNICITY




BRANCH OF SERVICE




POST-9/11 SERVICE



SERVICE-CONNECTED DISABLED






Military Veteran Farmer Statistics

Farms Operated by Producers with Military Service as Percent of All Farms, by County, 2017



The share of farms with producers who have served or are serving in the military is highest in the Southeast.

Programs



Farmer Veteran Fellowship Fund

Small grant program that provides direct assistance to farmer veterans with awards of \$1,000 to \$5,000

- Purchases made on behalf of farmer veteran for equipment and other related supplies
- Application opens at beginning of year with purchases made in the spring

Established in 2011 and has awarded approximately \$4 million in grants to more than 900 farmer veterans

Major sponsors include Wounded Warrior Project, Kubota Tractor Corporation, Tractor Supply Co., Farm Credit, and ADM







- In partnership with Kubota Tractor Corporation, the Geared to Give program provides equipment and grants through the Fellowship Fund
- Each year, Kubota awards five pieces of equipment through the Geared to Give program
- Since 2015, Geared to Give program has awarded 41 pieces of equipment to Farmer Veteran Coalition members









Homegrown By Heroes Label

- The official farmer veteran produced branded product program (only program of it's kind in the US)
- Certifies ranchers, farmers, foresters and fishermen to sell their products as veteran-owned and produced
- 13 partnerships with State Departments of Agriculture
- Over 2900 certified growers/producers
- HBH producers can sell products on MARKET

Homegrown By Heroes Certified Producers

- Together we promote the sale of products of American farmers who have served, and received certification to use the Homegrown By Heroes (HBH) label
- The intention is to help the farmer veterans with market access, obtain new customers by promoting their farms and ranches as well as their products on MarketMaker's website

FVC has over 2900 Homegrown By Heros, certified growers/producers





- In 2022, FVC began a partnership with AgCareers.com to support farmer veteran members find job opportunities in agriculture
- AgCareers.com operates the AgWarriors program; to connect <u>Ag companies looking to</u>
 <u>specifically hire veterans</u>, with veterans who are job seeking
- FVC hosts a plug-in on FarmVetCo.org that directly goes to AgCareers.com job searching function, to support <u>finding remote off-farm income</u>
- FVC developed a process with AgCareers.com to get farmer veterans directly in touch with AgCareers.com support staff and resources to job search or hire employees

Career Certification Pathway Program

• Focuses on technician jobs that require specialized certifications



There is a pilot program with Kubota, veterans receive job placement assistance

Grants



Enhancing Agricultural Opportunities for Military Veterans (AgVets)

USDA provides grants to nonprofits to increase the number of military veterans gaining knowledge and skills through comprehensive, hands-on and immersive model farm and ranch programs offered regionally that lead to successful careers in food/agriculture.

FVC's Award for 2021-2024 Grant Period

Objective to train at least 150 veterans through four partner programs:

- Archi's Acres
- Rodale Institute
- Dairy Grazing Apprenticeship
- Battleground to Breaking Ground







This grant supports USDA's historic commitment to lower barriers to access USDA programming to help underserved producers succeed.

FVC coordinates with other cooperators to focus on the needs of farmer veteran members through:

- Financial literacy
- Market planning
- Technical farming and peer support
- Introduction to USDA programs







SAMHSA Mental Health Awareness Training Project

This grant supports increased access to mental health and suicide preventions training and resources.

FVC and training partner, <u>Living Works</u>, will train 250 individuals per year through a variety of training methods as "gatekeepers" to suicide prevention

- Including online and in-person options,
- As well as train-the-trainer options
- A total of 1,000 trainees over the course of the grant, reaching an exponential number of additional individuals in the high risk agricultural, veteran and rural communities, including other FVC members.

An online community will be formed with <u>Psych Armor</u>, with projections of at least 1,000 FVC members and broader community members annually engaging there

- For additional community support
- For additional learning
- For training debriefing sessions
- An expected 4000+ member engagement over the course of the four-year grant period





National Programs In Development

Native American Agriculture Fund (NAAF)



FVC and NAAF partnered to identify the needs of native veterans through a survey and listening sessions. The findings will be incorporated in the final "Reimagining Native Food Economies" report

 Plan includes developing 10 regional food hubs throughout the country to provide native producers the infrastructure to create selfsustaining food systems for native and rural communities

Next, FVC is expanding the partnership between FVC and NAAF to provide support for the first regional food hub



FVC National Programs Coming Soon...

- A national FVC mentorship with HIVES, "Holistic Impactful Veteran Engagement Service"
- Securing grant funding for a national food safety program to increase market access for Farmer Veterans
- Expanding market access for Farmer Veterans through the HBH label, Market Maker and other partners (farm stands, farmers markets, csa's, online, corporate and institutions sales)
- National Emergency Relief Program
- Climate Smart Ag Initiative







- Ongoing projects in 13+ different states
- FVC and AgrAbility is a natural partnership;
 59% of FVC Members have a serviceconnected disability
- With a shared set of values, and similar missions to serve farmers, we enjoy a growing partnership between FVC and AgrAbility
