WHO WE ARE



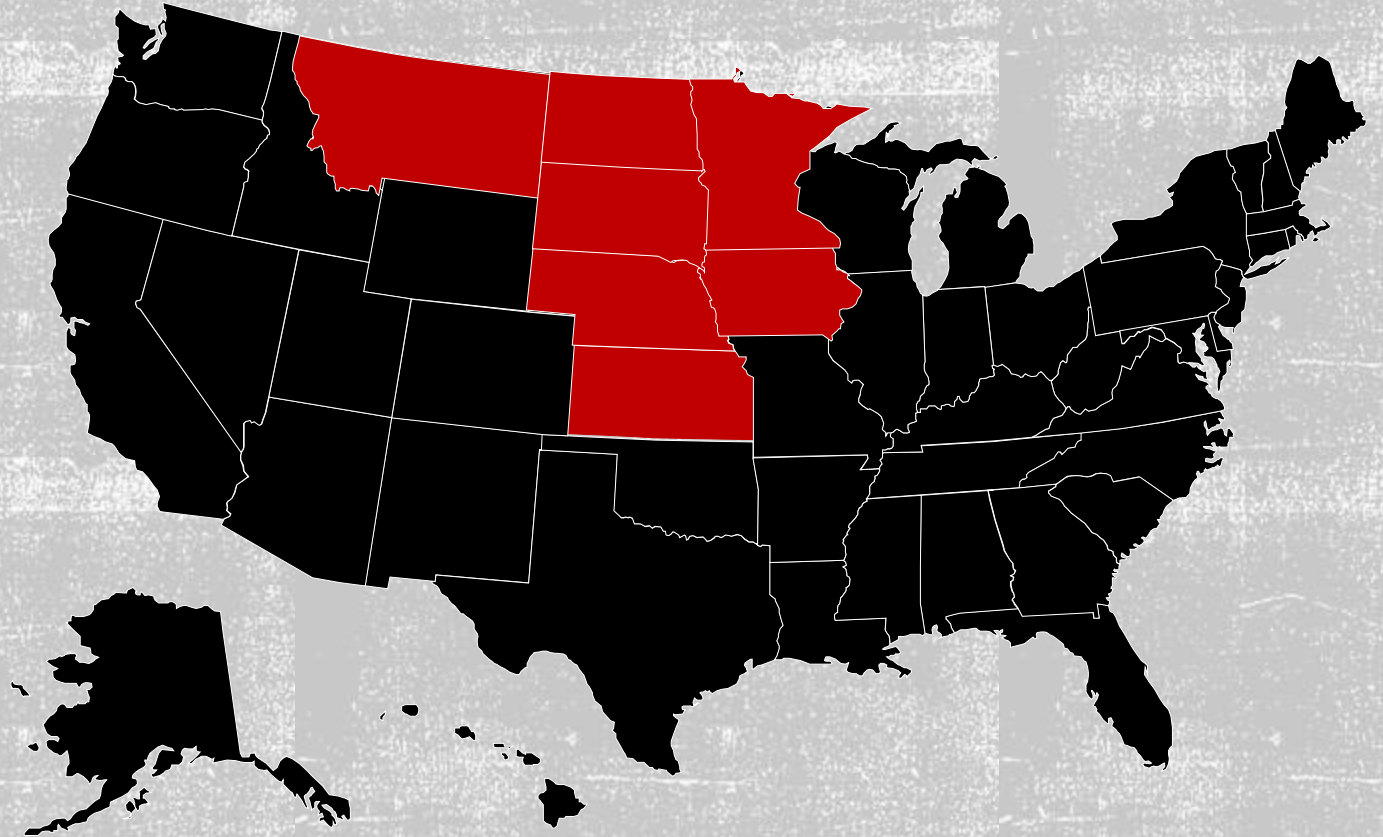
- Farm Rescue is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization
