Background



- Agricultural producers
 experience worse mental health
 than the general population.
- Additionally, they face more barriers to receiving mental health treatment.







- Goal: Improve the mental health of agricultural producers by reducing barriers to professional mental health care.
- The Illinois Agricultural Mental Health Voucher Program:
 - 1. Distributes vouchers for free professional behavioral health
 - 2. Connects producers with providers
 - 3. Trains providers in agricultural literacy





Voucher Distribution





Farmer requests a set of vouchers

Vouchers and provider directory

Vouchers redeemed with a provider

UIUC reimburses providers

By the numbers





A total of 204 individual voucher request have been made.



35 individuals have made repeat request for vouchers.



306 vouchers have been reimbursed directly to the participating provider.



Of the 204 individuals, 90 of them identify as working directly in agriculture and 110 said they were part of a farming family.





Licensed mental health providers from across the state

- 106 providers
- 38 counties (most offer teleservices)
- 2 Spanish-speaking providers







The training was developed to ensure mental health providers are prepared to work with agricultural clientele. All providers are encouraged to enroll and complete the course.

The Course:

- Describes unique characteristics of agriculture and agricultural work.
- Identifies common mental health and substance use challenges for agricultural producers.
- Explores strategies for working with farmers and agricultural workers.

Themes hearing among farmer clients



- General depression, anger, anxiety
- Limited access to resources such as counseling
- Marital stress
- Stress on entire family
- Worries about prices of grain/meat production
- Anxiety over instability of income
- Producers not wanting to disappoint their family with their concerns
